





Another Day In The Woods Along The Red River

November 15th, 7:30 in the morning setting in a tree with my longbow a 64" 50#@ 28" Predator Longbow equipped with cedar arrows and Wensel broad heads. I heard a deer running my direction, as it turns out it was a doe, being chased by an 8pt buck. Around in front of me they went, then back up the hill behind me. A few calls and a few minutes later the doe came back with two bucks chasing. This went on several times to the point where now there were two does and six bucks, within 20 yards still chasing, then all at once they stopped. Facing in the same direction, in walks a buck. I knew this was the one, at 12 yards broadside, I focused on the spot and then the arrow was there. God, thank you, this is GREAT!!!

1 hour and 30 minutes later, I am on the blood trail some 300 yards, NOT GOOD!!. So I got get my friends and start again. Some 500 yards later from where I left off, my arrow minus the broached was found but no deer!

Many long, hard days and hours of searching. 2 months later the landowner called my wife with good news. Roughly a mile from my stand.

Become a head hunter.

Fix up two or three arrows with judos and start head hunting. Stalk the woods and fields for dangerous wasps/bees. When they land give them a good judo shot and then put just their heads in a small plastic bottle. To make sure you can even find their heads you will learn you have to keep your eyes on where it lands/flops. All that matters is putting 100 heads into your little plastic bottle. After you have done this then start stump shooting and small game hunting out to 20-25yrds. When the time is right you will know when to start hunting deer.

Its hard to learn to shoot instinctive on a flat target, a 3D target helps a good deal but nothing works better than stump shooting to find your own instinctive shooting form. You will find that confidence is the greatest ally for the instinctive shooter.

Archery in Arizona


