Bobcat Talk by Bill Norman

"Whoa! That's a bobcat and he's looking straight at me." I had been walking quietly when I heard the faint scratch, scratch of the cat's claws on the live oak's limb directly above me. Only fifteen feet separated our eyes as I slowly began to draw my bow.


Informed by my boss, a true Texan, that deer hunting there was the best in the world, I had moved to Texas from Michigan in the spring of 1984. I knew my boss was a true Texan because he wore someone named M.L. Leddy's boots under his Brooks Brothers' suits. He said I'd see deer, turkey, fox, coyote, bobcat and just to make things interesting, an occasional rattlesnake. Being an avid bowhunter, that sounded good to me.

Opening day of deer season found me in a tree overlooking the famous Brazos River south of Fort Worth. There were several deer in sight, including two bucks, the likes of which I had not seen in eighteen years of bow hunting on public land in Michigan. I thought I had died and gone to heaven, and certainly the \$600 I had paid the rancher to hunt was proving to be one of my smartest "investments." I made no attempt to shoot at a deer that morning but I did try on several occasions to shoot at a turkey. Never having seen a turkey in the wild I was quickly gaining respect for their outstanding eyesight and strong will to live. I learned that morning that a turkey can see you blink at fifty yards and can see you change your mind at forty yards.

I bagged neither a deer nor a turkey that weekend but I did meet a Texan who would become one of my all-time best friends. Charles took me under his wing and showed me how we "do things in Texas." Most importantly, he showed me the value of this device called a corn feeder. With a good feeder the odds of taking a deer with a bow changed from maybe 50-1 to 10-1, and in the case of turkeys from maybe 500-1 to 499-1.

With the sun setting on Sunday evening of the third weekend I decided to call it a day. I was thinking about the drive home as I walked under the tree that harbored the bobcat. Surprisingly, I was very calm as I started to draw my bow. And then he did it. From somewhere deep within him he let out a growl that started very, very low and ended very, very high. That was enough bobcat hunting for me!

I arrived back at our camp area in record time and Charles was waiting to see if I had any luck. When I finished relating what had just happened Charles laughed and said, "Bill, you let that bobcat talk you out of it."

The Crossbow Issue


It seems unfair that crossbow legalization can be brought up year after year only to be rejected. Then one day it passes and it's forever a part of the archery only season. That's just like saying in a best of 7 World Series in baseball, that one team only has to win once to be named World Champions forever.

Reminds me about the movie "Eight Men Out", everyone in TX was told upfront the crossbow issue was a forgone conclusion, everyone was told there was no opposition and there wasn't anything the bowhunters could do to stop it. The crossbow hasn't really been opposed to a great degree AFTER it's legalization.

My personal wants for TX, now dictated by the crossbow agenda, is to lobby for a new "1968 original archery only season" only during a different time frame in Sept. Recurves, long bows, and compounds with restrictions(65% let off, hand held-hand drawn and hand released, no tigers, and limited to one sight pin). Will this ever happen, maybe when it snows in heck.

But first I'd go back and do exactly what HB968 did, modify the existing law. Restrict the use of crossbows to the handicap, youth and those over 65yrs of age and return the verbage that archery equipment must be hand held, hand drawn, and hand released otherwise. If bowhunters would join together and inflict enough pain and suffering on the ATA-NRA Team by writing letters and a boycott they would welcome this compromise in TX. For some reason the ATA-NRA team think they're bullet proof on this issue, I do not agree.



My Project for the Montgomery County Fair, 2009

My name is Zachary Gladden and I am a student at Oak Ridge High School. For my F.F.A. project this year I made a Turkish Recurve bow and two arrows from raw materials. I entered the bow and arrows in the Montgomery County Fair and won Reserve Grand Champion honors in wood working.

The project took me about six months to complete and I worked on the bow and arrows in my spare time. I used ash wood and fiber glass for the bow. It was shaped using a curved patterned form. I made the finished shape using hand sanding and a belt sander. The bow was stained brown and sealed with 8 coats of clear polyurethane. The bow string is made of Dacron and I set the draw weight of the bow to 55 lbs at 27 inches.

I made the arrows using sitka spruce wood, turkey feathers and twine made of sinew. The arrow heads were cut out from a flat piece of steal with a small band saw. They were shaped and sharpened with a belt sander. The feathers and arrow heads were attached to the arrow shafts by wrapping them with sinew.

Bow and arrow making has become my favorite hobby. I plan to continue to make them and use my homemade bows to hunt in the future. I plan to enter another bow this year in the 2010 Montgomery County Fair as well as the Houston Junior non livestock show.







TBoT also holds shoots across the state to offer the membership the opportunity to participate without traveling great distances. TBoT members pay a reduced entry fee at TBoT shoots. At all 3-D type events, children 12 and under shoot free, even if their parents are not members. Also, all children receive trophies, medals, or some other type of award for participation.

The quarterly newsletter contains information about activities within the organization, news of other traditional events across Texas, hunting and tournament photos, and stories—both factual and fictitious—submitted by members. There is a free classified ad section for use by the membership. If a member has a question about equipment or hunting situations, there are a number of bowyers, arrow crafters, and outfitters in the membership to answer questions.

So, if you are still wondering who or what the Traditional Bowhunters of Texas are, chances are, you are one. Why not take time and join today?
