Carp, Aluminum Cans, & Bow

I'd rather bowfish for carp than bowhunt for deer!

Why would I make such a statement? For sure there is more excitement and "glory" in bagging a trophy whitetail buck than a lowly mudgrubbing carp. As for tablefare, the fillets of the two can't be compared. A chicken-fried venison steak stands alone and shelf-high above a carp fillet, no matter how a carp fillet is prepared.

Again, why state I'd rather hunt carp than deer? Well, there is not a season on carp, no bag limit; however, there is a restriction on the length of carp: Only one carp 33 inches or longer can be taken daily. Otherwise, shoot until your bow arm tires. Another lawful restriction for emphasis: Shot carp must not be tossed into the water nor thrown upon the bank. It's the responsibility of the bowfisher to dispose of the carp properly and lawfully.

How may this be done without too much effort? Several ways. For example, eaten. Though carp have umpteen Y-bones along the rib cage, and people won't bother to dress carp "because they're too bony", the problem is easily taken care of. Instead of slicing through the rib cage and down to the tail, start the slicing below the rib cage. Of course, some meat is wasted but no worry about bones. The fillets can be prepared several ways: bake, barbecue, boil, can, grill, doube-ground for meat-balls, and smoked.

What about the offal (carcasses)? No problem. If not used - uses mentioned below - double-sack'em in plastic bags and put the bags in the trash and let the garbage truck haul'em to the landfill.

The carcasses can be frozen and used later for pet food. Years ago, there was an alligator farm in the Cross Timbers that accepted carp and fed'em to the animals.

There are other ways of disposing of carp. Trotliners use carp for bait. Trappers do the same thing. Rendering companies convert carp into a protein supplement for livestock.

Before I give away the carp I've shot, I weigh the largest carp and remove its dorsal fin, clean and dry it. I mount it on a large board, along with other carp fins, and below it, I put a small metal plate with the date, location, and weight. Finally, I record the hunt in my bowhunting diary, which I have kept of every hunt since August, 1959, when I started in archery and bowhunting.

When I get tired of shooting - or bored if there isn't any action - I look for aluminum cans. I carry a couple of large plastic bags in my fanny pack and walk the banks of the creek, stream, river, or lake where I am bowfishing and sack cans. I pick up enough cans to buy a few gallons of gas. Doing this during the hunt, I figure I'm helping in controlling the carp, protecting the game fishes, putting fillets in the freezer, providing pet food for the neighbors' pets, getting exercise, and having fun. Sure beats sitting in a deer stand for hours without seeing a flash of a whitetail. Also, the hunting seaon is open, and you can hunt carp, aluminum can, and shoot the bow nearly the year 'round, except during inclimate weather. Remember to be legal, don't litter, and don't trespass.

Bowfishing the Dragon Lake -Lake Leon

Nicknamed a dragon lake because of its distinctive shape, the 1,590acre impoundment, fed by the Leon River in the Cross Timbers area of north central Texas, has been known during its 50-plus years (impounded in September, 1959) as a catfish lake. Local bowfishers tapped its non-game fishes for years. Only within the past decade or two have other bowbenders bowfished for the lake's roughfishes.

Lake Leon straddles the Leon River a few miles south of IH20 between Eastland and Ranger. To drive to the lake, exit either at Eastland onto FM 2214, or at Ranger onto FM 2461. Public boat ramps, campsites, and supplies are available on each route.

A recreation permit for an individual is \$2/day; for a family, \$5/day; camping for a family is \$5/day. An individual permit for a year is \$20; camping permit for a family is \$40/yr. A bowfisher must have a valid hunting/fishing license and a recreational permit. All non-gamefishes are legal, and bowfishing is legal all year... anytime. Don't litter; the fine can knock a hole in your wallet!

Permits may be purchased at the Lake Leon Information Office, at the dam on FM 2461. The lake is under the management of the Eastland County Water Supply District (ECWSD).


Leon is a pretty lake, with nearly 50 miles of shoreline, interrupted by sloughs and draws, with the Leon River watershed providing water for the main pool.

As with most fisheries, Spring is the best time to bowfish. Access is fairly easy for boaters and waders. If you wade and bowfish, be careful that you don't trespass. Also, don't toss the roughfish back into water or onto the bank to rot ingloriously. The fine for littering is costly. Don't forget to carry your license and permit while bowfishing.

Lake Leon is the final leg in the triangle of Cross Timbers lakes, moving north from Proctor to Palo Pinto, southwest to Leon, and back to Lake Proctor. Each lake is easily accessible, has amenities for bowfishing, and plenty of non-gamefish.

Bodkin Broadheads Stop Llano River Cottontails

One afternoon during a water-break from checking cotton for insect infestations, Knox Walker, Texas A&M entomologist, asked me (graduate PhD entomology student) if I would like to fish for spotted bass on the Llano River, west of Llano, Texas, on the O.O. Henderson Ranch. He said we would camp on the river, fish, and bowhunt cottontail rabbits. Of course, I accepted readily.

We would leave College Station on a Friday and return on Monday, in the middle of September. All I had to take was a current hunting/fishing license, fishing gear, bowhunting equipment, a cot, a blanket, sun tan lotion, plenty of insect repellent, and personal gear. He said not to worry about chow; he would take care of it.

We left A&M after lunch and arrived at the Henderson Ranch before sundown. Mr. Henderson - fondly called Double "O" - met us and told Knox to park anywhere along the river. Also, he told us that we could store the fish in their freezer until we were ready to leave.

We drove to the camp area and set up camp. By dark, we were settled in and discussing the river, lures, and likely spots to fish. I was pumped up, bright-eyed and bushy-tailed to get started.

"Morrison, coffee's ready," Knox called at daylight while he squatted by the camp stove pouring coffee. "I'll have a batch of eggs and bacon ready in a few minutes. As soon as we clean up camp, we'll hit the water. If we're lucky, we'll clean enough fish for supper. The rest Double O's wife will package and freeze for us."

It didn't take long to gobble the chow and head for the river.

The morning was great; the water cool and pleasant. We caught plenty of spots. Had a noon snack, an afternoon snooze, and fried fish for supper.

"Morrison, if you want to rabbit hunt while I take the fish to Mrs. Henderson, go ahead. There're plenty around, just ease up the road to-



ward the gate; you should get all the shooting you want. If you like rabbit for the table, clean what you kill, and Mrs. Henderson will freeze'em for you."

"Sounds good to me," I answered.

I remembered the photos of the rabbits Pappy (forget his last name) shot here the past Spring. "If I can do half as well as Pappy, I'll be lucky. See you around dark-thirty."

I strung my right-handed Bear Polar, pulling 45 pounds at 28 inches, loaded the 4-arrow quiver with home-made, wooden arrows tipped with 3bladed Bodkin heads, and walked to the gravel road leading to the front gate. Cat-claw brush, prickly pear cactus, and scrawny mesquites lined the road. I stopped at the gate and turned around. No rabbits.

By now, the sun was just three fingers from sunset. I walked slowly, stopping every four or five steps and scanning the brush. I started to follow a well-worn cow trail into the thickets, but it would be too noisy. I slowly proceeded along the road toward camp. I hadn't seen a hair of any animal domestic or wild. By now, the sun was winking good night to the east as it settled below the western horizon.

Thinking more of Pappy's rabbit stories than looking for the critters, my mind slipped into neutral, only casually glancing ahead and into the brush.

"Oops! There's one."

Quite a ways in the brush from the road, the rabbit sat eating needle grass leaves. I stopped, kinda judging the distance, thinking the rabbit was too far for a shot. Anxiety overtook my judgment. I slowly, concentrating, raised the bow, drew and anchored, and released. The arrow zipped like a rocket toward the unconcerned rabbit and ricocheted into the brush.

"Good gosh! My only shot of the evening and I overshot."

Disgusted, I marked the spot where I last saw the arrow drop into the grass and started walking toward the spot to retrieve the arrow.

What a surprise when I walked to the spot where the rabbit had been numching its salad. Three or four yards beyond, there was a dead cottontail. "Hmmm, the arrow dropped right into the rabbit, and all I saw was the arrow headed toward the river.

I stepped off the distance from where I was standing to where the rabbit was sitting. It was 35 yards ... longest shot I ever made on a cotton-



tail. This prize and a few more Llano cottontails went into Mrs. Henderson's freezer befoe we returned to A & M.

Since I started shooting the bow in August, 1959, this shot was one of the best five shots I have ever made on game. And, one of the most memorable.






