#### A LONG AND BUMPY ROAD

When the next newsletter comes out, there will be a new President, and a new Editor. After almost 10 years, I have had enough and will be stepping down from everything. I would like to take this opportunity to tell a little about TBoT and myself.

In 1990, Loren Berhens, Roland Jenkins, Billy Moreton and myself decided to start a traditional only club to have shoots for the growing number of traditional shooters around the East Texas area. We talked to the guys at the Piney Woods Archery Club in Trinity about using their range and we were in business.

In February, 1991, we put out the word about our monthly traditional only shoots. I took \$275.00 of my own money and bought trophies, and we went to the range and hoped enough people came to at least get my money back. It went better than expected. I got my money back. We paid Piney Woods their cut and put about \$200.00 in the bank. We were off and running and never looked back.

We held monthly shoots through September and started selling some T-shirts to get our name and logo out on the streets. We sold T-shirts for the first 2 years at cost to get them out there for folks to see. That year we held our first big shoot, the Deer Season Kickoff and held a raffle to raise a little extra money. I also started sending out a very basic newsletter that simply let folks know what was coming up.

In 1994, we decided to try something new and the 1st texas Hill Country Shootout was held at the South Hills Ranch. It was a success and has been growing ever since with almost \$30,000.00 worth of prizes being given away in the last 3 years.

In 1996, we held our first elections at the Hill Country Shootout in Vaderpool, and Bubba Schmidt was elected TBoT's first President and Wyatt Birkner was elected Vice President. Steve Hawkins was elected Range Captain, Ron McGee was elected Secretary, and I was elected Treasurer and Editor.

During the time TBoT was started and our first elections, there was a group of us that were serving as directors with no real officers. As time went on, most sort of drifted on and a couple of us just plugged along watching the club grow. When the club had money, we bought targets, gave away prizes and built up the newsletter. Several times, when the club would be low on funds, I would kick in some out of my pocket and when things got better, I would get it back again.

Over the years, several things were decided that still stands today. All kids under 12 shoot free whether their folks are members or not. If you help set up the range, you also shoot for free.

We tried several class combinations at the shoots and finally settled on the ones we use today along with our equipment rules which are simply recurve or longbow. Bring it and have fun.

We've had some javelina hunts with Jeff Massie, hog hunts at the Bug Scuffle Ranch and 3-D shoots all over Texas. I made a lot of decisions by myself over the years and I always tried to do what I thought the membership would like. As far as events go, they have always seemed to be the right ones.

The last 10 years have been fun, exasperating, trying, and enjoyable. There are few out there that have gotten a gut full of me, but, there are a lot of you that always shake my hand and swap a couple of stories. That is what has made this as enjoyable as it has been and I thank you.

A friend of mine once told me that when it's not fun anymore, it's time to move on. It's not fun anymore. It is a lot of work and takes a lot of time and I don't have the time I used to. My kids are older and into a lot of new things and we are going to do some things they like for a while (which luckily seem to include hunting) and raise a few show goats. So, I would like to thank all of you that have supported me and supported TBoT. Hopefully, I'll see you around, but right now, Zach and I are going huntin'.

May all your arrows fly true and if your bowstring breaks, give me a call, 'cause I do still make 'em.



## EL NINO BUCK By Wayne Tarpley

As the sun sunk lower in the afternoon sky, I wondered if the 65 degree temperatures in late November would possibly prevent deer movement before dark. It had been unseasonably warm so far in 1998 in North Texas and there were no acorns due to the drought conditions brought on by El Nino earlier in the year. The positives were that I was setup in an area with good buck sign in the late rut and there was enough of a South wind to keep the mosquitoes blown off of me at the 10-11 foot level of my tree stand.

After being on stand for only two hours, a nice 130-140 class buck trotted up to within 80 yards of my tree and then turned & walked back to where he came from. I hoped that before dark the buck might work his way nearer my position and possibly offer a shot. I wouldn't have long to wait.

Continuing my vigil for only another 10 minutes or so, I again noticed movement in the area where the buck had disappeared. Approximately 125-130 yards out, I spotted a doe slowly walking in my general direction followed by two bucks. The first buck was a real whopper & the buck that I had seen previously rounded out the trio. The three deer continued to walk toward my area until the doe got to within approximately 80 yards. At this point, she broke into a run directly toward me with both bucks following! In a matter of seconds, the doe ran past my position on a faint trail no more than 10 yards from my tree. During the next few moments, time seemed to standstill. As the big buck closed to within 15-20 yards following the same path as the doe, I grunted with my mouth in an attempt to stop him or slow him down. However, with every step, he was emitting a "tending grunt" of his own and either he didn't hear me or he chose to ignore me and he never slowed down. As he passed 10 yards from my tree, I focused on his chest and drew my Bill Stewart recurve in one fluid motion, releasing a 2-bladed Zwickey tipped 2018 Classic shaft. Seeing the arrow strike the buck, I was shocked that it did not pass all the way through him.

As the buck raced along the same path taken by the doe, I could see about 12 inches of arrow protruding up from the rear chest area of the buck.

Meanwhile, the second buck following right along in the same path as the previous two deer. As the trio disappeared from sight, I noted that it was only 3:15 PM and now I had to deal with a large dose of adrenaline!

After 25 minutes, I could stand it no longer and I climbed down to take up the trail. Immediately I had good blood and after trailing for a little over 150 yards, I saw the buck laying in front of me. My arrow had stuck the off-side leg preventing a complete pass through of the 520 grain arrow. The buck had apparently expired in only moments after passing out of sight. I knelt admiring the buck and gave thanks to the Lord for allowing me to harvest such a magnificent animal. The feelings were a mixture of both happiness with the harvest and sadness over the fact that such a beautiful animal was now gone.

The buck field dressed 155 lbs. and he was aged at only 4 & 1/2 years old. Thinking that the buck would gross in the 170's, I was quite pleasantly surprised the next day when we measured him. However, several days later an official Pope & Young scorer 'green scored" the 13 point buck as 188 & 7/8 Gross Non-Typical, netting 182 & 7/8 Non-Typical. The deer achieved this score with two points broken off his left brow tine and one broken off the right brow tine. His inside spread was only 18 inches: however his G2 tines were 13 inches & 16 inches long. Regardless of the score, I am thankful for the buck and I'll never forget the vision of the buck with his double white throat patch running toward my tree in the late afternoon November sunlight! El Nino had finally resulted in something positive.

The buck was harvested November 27, 1998 at Hagerman Wildlife Refuge on the shores of Lake in North Texas. This was the 3rd hunt segment of 1998 consisting of 65 hunters. Out of 65 hunters, only 6 deer were harvested during this segment. Out of a total of 197 hunters hunting all 3 segments, 19 deer were harvested.




